Germany, Migrants and Angela Merkel's Big Lie

DURING RECENT TRIPS TO VIENNA, HANNOVER, STOCKACH AND Zurich, I discussed Europe's migrant crisis with friends and other travelers. Each had his stories and anecdotes, his concerns and frustrations, and, of course, his particular solutions. But nearly every person I spoke with shared an interesting concern,



and one with enormous and alarming consequences.

I was told multiple times that there is a growing belief among Germans that they are being intentionally misled and even deliberately lied to—by Angela Merkel and her pro-migrant allies in the government and the media.

A growing number of Germans are

feeling betrayed and want *change*. They want a leader who will listen to their anxieties, defend their interests, and protect Germany.

In Stockach, I had coffee with a 20-year-old man who works as a security guard at a refugee camp containing more than 1,000 migrants. The camp, he explained, is a mix between a pigsty and a war zone. This man had witnessed migrants refuse to use the portable toilets. There was also rampant sexual abuse, rape, fights and knifings, and regular clashes between religious and ethnic foes. Are local politicians expressing concern about this in public? I asked. Is the local media reporting on what's happening inside these camps?

They are totally silent, he said.

There are plenty more anecdotes like this, though you have to search for them. Tania Kambouri is a police officer in Germany and a bestselling author. In a recent radio interview, Kambouri discussed the migrants and Germany's deteriorating security situation.

"For weeks, months and years I have noticed that Muslims, mostly young men, do not have even a minimum level of respect for the police," she said. "When we are out patrolling the streets, we are verbally abused by young Muslims."

"I WISH THESE PROBLEMS WERE RECOGNIZED AND CLEARLY ADDRESSED! ... It cannot be that offenders continue to fill the police files, hurt us physically, insult us, whatever, and there are no consequences. Many cases are closed, or offenders are released on probation. ... Yes, what is happening in the courts today is a joke. The growing disrespect, the increased violence against police We are losing control of the streets."

Why isn't Angela Merkel talking with the German people about this? Why is the mainstream media burying stories like this?

On November 24, the Gatestone Institute published an article titled "Germans Opposed to Mass Migration Are 'Free to Leave.'" The title came from a statement by the district president of Kassel, a city in the state of Hesse, who stated that German citizens who disagree with the government's open-door immigration policy are "free to leave Germany." The article described a recent proposal by the mayor of Berlin to create emergency legislation that allows local authorities to seize private residences and office buildings to accommodate asylum seekers.

The mayor's legislation "would effectively suspend Germany's constitutional guarantee of private property." It "would authorize police forcibly to enter private homes and apartments without a warrant to determine their suitability as housing for refugees and migrants." AND THE MAYOR TRIED TO KEEP THE PROPOSAL SECRET FROM THE GERMAN PUBLIC!

In Bad Tolz, Bavaria, local government officials recently condemned a nightclub owner after he banned male migrants from his club when female patrons complained that they were being harassed. Local politicians and media branded the manager a "Nazi" and a "racist." Incidents like this are happening daily in towns and cities across Germany, yet the authorities, local and federal, simply refuse to talk about it. WORSE STILL, THEY ARE ATTACKING THOSE WHO DO EXPRESS ALARM AND CONCERN!

Last October, *Bild* reported that the government was secretly expecting 1.5 million migrants to arrive in Germany in 2015.

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The official government figure at the time was 800,000, and the government flatly rejected the *Bild* story. The point is, the Merkel government *knew* the figure was going to be significantly higher than 800,000 back in October, *but it refused to reveal this to the German people*—EVEN AFTER *BILD* REPORTED ON THE 1.5 MILLION FIGURE!

In October, *Die Welt* reported on a government document leaked to the paper by German intelligence officials. If she continues to do this, Germany's chancellor risks transforming the German people—and Germany itself—into something very different and much more frightening than the democratic, peaceful, friendly, nation Germany is today.

'Highly Provocative': Iran Rocket Launch Near U.S. Ship Latest Challenge for Washington Fox News | December 30

DESPITE THE OBAMA ADMINISTRATION TOUTING ITS IRAN nuclear deal as a triumph of diplomacy that finally thaws a four-decade freeze, Tehran appears to be doing all it can to keep the flames of confrontation burning.

The latest challenge was a missile launch over the weekend less than a mile from a U.S. aircraft carrier—which came on the heels of two other similar incidents, two ballistic missile tests, and the harsh treatment of American prisoners including a *Washington Post* journalist.

These provocations, with the country potentially weeks away from receiving billions in sanctions relief under the nuclear deal, are fueling renewed concerns in Washington about whether Iran will be held to account for violations.

"Missile-tests, cyberattacks, Americans taken hostage, and now this," House Foreign Affairs Committee Chairman Ed Royce, R-Calif., said in a statement Wednesday. "Until the Obama administration starts holding the Iranian regime accountable, we'll see more of these hostile acts that put American lives in danger."

The most recent confrontation occurred Saturday, when five Iranian Revolutionary Guard vessels approached the USS Harry S. Truman, and one of them fired multiple unguided missiles within 1,500 yards of the U.S. aircraft carrier transiting the Strait of Hormuz. It was the third such provocation in the past 14 months, a spokesman for the Navy's 5th Fleet, responsible for operations in the Persian Gulf, told Fox News.

"It's getting closer," Cmdr. Kevin Stephens said in discussing this trend of Iranian provocation near U.S. aircraft carrier battle groups. ...

Twenty-one Democratic senators ... wrote to Obama last week voicing concerns about [Iran's missile tests]: "If there are no consequences for this violation, Iran's leaders will certainly also question the willingness of the international community to respond to violations of the [nuclear agreement]." ...

After Islamic State Is Defeated, Shiite Forces to Take Over Jerusalem Post | December 29

T HE WESTERN-BACKED WAR AGAINST THE SUNNI ISLAMIC STATE is setting the stage for the rise of an Iran-led Shiite crescent across the region.

From contiguous territory stretching from Afghanistan to Iran and through Iraq, Syria and Lebanon, Shiite influence would increase.

Just as the U.S.-led coalition war against Iraq in 2003 toppled the Sunni power and removed an obstacle for Iran to spread its influence in the overwhelmingly Shiite country, the removal of Islamic State would give Iran the upper hand against its Sunni enemies.

In fact, many Sunnis support Islamic State not necessarily because they are true believers, but in a show of solidarity against an Iranian-led Shiite onslaught.

With the aid of attacks on Islamic State by Western forces and

Russia, Iran and its militia allies can prepare for an onslaught on the remaining Sunni rebel forces in Syria. And from there, the Iran axis would look to penetrate neighboring Jordan as well as expand its support of the Houthis in Yemen. ...

[Phillip Smyth, a researcher specializing in Shiite Islamist groups at the University of Maryland's Laboratory for Computational Cultural Dynamics] predicts that there is likely to be an internal tug of war over who controls [Shiites in a post-Islamic State region].

If Iraq's top Shiite cleric, Grand Ayatollah Ali Sistani, dies, then Smyth says there would be a number of rising clerics competing to fill the void.

"Iran is attempting to sink its talons into the clerical realm," he continued, noting that Iran already has power on the ground, via its militias, to help support its agenda. ...

White House Delays Imposing New Sanctions on Iran for Missile Program Wall Street Journal | December 31

T HE WHITE HOUSE HAS DELAYED ITS PLAN TO IMPOSE NEW FINANcial sanctions on Iran for its ballistic missile program, according to U.S. officials, amid growing tensions with Iran over the nuclear deal struck earlier this year.

The officials said the Obama administration remains committed to combating Iran's missile program and that sanctions being developed by the U.S. Treasury Department remain on the table. ... Republican leaders on Thursday accused the Obama administration of losing its will to challenge Iran after Tehran countered on Thursday that it would accelerate the development of its arsenal.

"If the president's announced sanctions ultimately aren't executed, it would demonstrate a level of fecklessness that even the president hasn't shown before," said Rep. Mike Pompeo, a leading critic of the nuclear deal, in an interview.

Monitor: More Than 55,000 Killed in Syria in 2015 Agence France-Presse | December 31

T HE TOTAL NUMBER OF DEAD SINCE THE BEGINNING OF THE CONflict had reached more than 260,000, the Britain-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said, though the number of those killed in 2015 was lower than the 76,021 people who died in 2014.

In 2015 alone, the monitor documented the deaths of 55,219 people, including 13,249 civilians. Among them were 2,574 children, it said. ...

The group also documented the deaths of 17,686 regime forces, among them over 8,800 Army troops, more than 7,000 Syrian pro-regime militiamen, and 378 members of Lebanon's Hezbollah

PRESIDENT BARACK OBAMA ANNOUNCED TWO YEARS AGO HE would curtail eavesdropping on friendly heads of state after the world learned the reach of long-secret U.S. surveillance programs.

But behind the scenes, the White House decided to keep certain allies under close watch, current and former U.S. officials said. Topping the list was Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu.

The U.S., pursuing a nuclear arms agreement with Iran at the time, captured communications between Mr. Netanyahu and his aides that inflamed mistrust between the two countries and planted a political minefield at home when Mr. Netanyahu later took his campaign against the deal to Capitol Hill.

Hamas Says It Plans to Resume Suicide Attacks in Israel Times of Israel | December 31

PALESTINIAN TERROR GROUP HAMAS IS REPORTEDLY PLANNING to resume suicide bombing attacks against Israelis, including "political and security figures."

According to Lebanon's *The News*, cited by the Hebrew-language *Maariv* daily on Thursday, a Hamas source said the attacks would be carried out by the organization's "sleeper cells," which have been directed to strike targets inside Israel.

The paper quoted a Hamas leader as saying that "the operations will be carried out soon, and include a list of targets that includes political and security figures inside Israel."

The attacks are reportedly to focus on army and police officials.

Hamas sources also claimed that it was maintaining ties with members of Palestinian Authority President Mahmoud Abbas's Fatah movement.

Israeli officials are aware of the directive to resume the bombings, *The News* reported. Israel 10 days ago uncovered a Hamas movement.

A total of 1,214 foreign fighters from other countries, including Iraq, Iran and Afghanistan, died fighting for the regime, the Observatory said. ...

Syria's conflict began with peaceful anti-government protests but descended into a brutal civil war after a regime crackdown on dissent.

A senior Palestinian Authority source told the *Times of Israel* last week that Hamas is attempting to launch major terror attacks against Israel, including suicide bombings, from the West Bank. The current attacks have yet to include suicide bombings, which killed hundreds of Israelis during the Second Intifada at the start of the millennium, and led to a massive Israeli military operation in the West Bank aimed at ending them.

T Pope Francis: Europe's Top Unifier Richard Palmer | January 4

POPE FRANCIS IS TO BE AWARDED EUROPE'S TOP PRIZE FOR PROmoting unity.

That news will come as no surprise to those familiar with theTrumpet.com. For years we've said the Catholic Church must play a powerful role in European unity.

The European Common Market has "so far ... been unable to bring about full political union," wrote Herbert W. Armstrong in his book *The United States and Britain in Prophecy.* "This will be made possible by the 'good offices' of the Vatican, who alone can be the symbol of unity to which they can look."

Few see the signs of the Vatican playing this role, so far. But now, as Europe is becoming increasingly desperate for unity with the euro, the border-free Schengen zone, and even the European Union itself under threat—we're seeing more signs that it will look to the Vatican.

The International Charlemagne Prize of Aachen will go to Pope Francis, the prize committee announced on December 23. The prize is given to those who perform "exceptional work ... in the service of European unity."

Europe has gone through seven years of "weakness, crises and setbacks" causing "a dramatic loss of confidence" wrote the prize committee. "In these times, in which many citizens in Europe seek orientation," the pope "sends a message of love and encouragement," it wrote.

The Charlemagne Prize's website states that the award's recipients "are the people who most often work toward integration and who are able to exercise a political influence."

Pope John Paul II was the first pope to be given the Charlemagne award, just before his death in 2004. He is the only person to ever be given the "Charlemagne Prize Extraordinary." His award focused on his role in defeating communism, allowing Eastern and Western Europe to come together.

Pope Francis has merely continued the policy of many of his predecessors.

The *Economist* magazine writes that "the selectors are adamant that Pope Francis, more than anybody else, has breathed new life into the construction of Europe at a time when that effort was sagging."

In its announcement of the pope's prize, the awards committee quoted from statements made by the pope directed at Europe most heavily his 2014 address to the European Parliament.

Unity was the key focus of that parliamentary address. The pope said that he was there to bring "a message of hope and encouragement to all the citizens of Europe."

"It is a message of hope, based on the confidence that our problems can become powerful forces for unity in working to overcome all those fears which Europe—together with the entire world—is presently experiencing," he said.

While so many of the EU's founders saw their work through a Catholic lens, many today do not. But at this crucial juncture, with Europe struggling for unity, it is the pope that is singled out as offering hope for the future.

And it is not just the Charlemagne Prize Committee that sees this hope.

The Konrad Adenauer Foundation is the think tank for German Chancellor Angela Merkel's Christian Democratic Union. In Germany, all the political parties have a think tank affiliated with them to help formulate their policy. In November, the foundation produced a paper called "Microstate and Superpower—the Vatican in International Politics." The conclusion is clear from the title—the Vatican is a superpower. More specifically, though, it notes the power of the Catholic Church as a mediator and a unifier.

The Vatican, the authors write, "has, in fact, been involved in central decision-making and events of world politics for a long time, acting patiently behind the scenes, particularly since the middle of the 20th century."

The lengthy, but fascinating, paper goes through example after example, from the Cold War right up until the present day where the Catholic Church has established itself as a mediator. The Vatican has developed considerable "soft power … based on its reputation as an honest broker, a role whose impact has been increasing since the end of the Cold War."

The pope is now reaching out to the world "not just as head of the church and head of state but as a moral authority," they write.

As unity is becoming an increasingly desperate need for all of Europe, the think tank for Angela Merkel's party is thinking about the Vatican's track record for bringing exactly that.

Europe's crises are far from over. As times get dark, this hope for unity held out by the Vatican will burn even brighter and gain even more attention. The historical precedent for this source of unity goes far beyond the EU's founding fathers. The Charlemagne Prize is certainly an appropriate award for the pope: Charlemagne also used the Catholic Church to bring unity to his empire 1,200 years ago. Charlemagne, or Charles the Great, brought a good chunk of the Continent together as one empire, and he did it through the help of one church.

As the *Catholic Encyclopedia* noted, Charlemagne's legacy was "the idea of a Europe welded together out of various races under the spiritual influence of one Catholic faith and one vicar of Christ"

This is the heritage the Charlemagne Prize deliberately revives, and it's one European leaders are very familiar with. History shows them that the road to European unity goes through the Vatican.

Two Thirds of Germans Expect ISIS Attack in 2016 The Local | 30 December

MAJORITY OF GERMANS EXPECT THE TERRORIST GROUP ISIS TO attack the country in the coming year.

Even Europe's humanitarian superpower is turning its back on refugees Washington Post, December 30

W HEN THE SMALL, CRUMPLED BODY OF 3-YEAR-OLD ALAN KURDI washed up on the Aegean coast September 2, Europe's humanitarian superpower sprang into action.

Sweden's prime minister headlined gala fundraisers, Swedish celebrities starred in telethons, and a country that prides itself on doing the right thing seemed to rally as one to embrace refugees fleeing for their lives.

But after taking in more asylum seekers per capita than any other nation in Europe, Sweden's welcome mat now lies in tatters. Overwhelmed by the human tide of 2015, the center-left government is deploying extraordinary new border controls and slashing benefits in an unmistakable signal to refugees contemplating the long trek to Sweden in the new year: Stay out. ...

Those limits can be readily seen in a tent camp where dozens of migrants are bedding down in the frigid Nordic winter and at the train station where many new arrivals are turned back within minutes of setting foot on Swedish soil. ...

The impact of such controls could be felt far beyond Sweden:

The country's dramatic shift threatens to wreak havoc all the way down Europe's migrant trail in 2016 by setting off a domino effect in which countries seal their borders for fear that their neighbors will do the same.

Barriers have already risen across the Continent, primarily in the transit nations for migrants traveling by land into wealthy Western Europe. ...

But Sweden's abrupt reversal is potentially far more consequential. Across Europe this year, two countries have stood out for their uncommonly generous reception policies: Sweden and Germany.

Now, Sweden is actively trying to keep people out, while German Chancellor Angela Merkel is under pressure from critics within her own center-right coalition to do the same after the country welcomed a record 1 million asylum seekers this year....

Despite repeated pledges from E.U. officials about the need to gain control of the Continent's external borders, there has been little concrete action. ...

Tpbillion euros to go toward refugees in Germany: Germany's federal states may put around \$18.5 billion toward handling the refugee crisis in 2016, *Die Welt* said this morning. The figure comes from a survey taken of regional finance ministries. The expenditure will exceed the amount Germany put toward the education and research ministry in 2015. The newspaper added that actual costs will probably be even higher. The budget was created using the federal government's estimate that 800,000 refugees would enter Germany in 2015. That figure has already been surpassed. At the end of November, 965,000 refugees had arrived in Germany.

Brave New War Atlantic | December 29

F ROM CHINA IN ASIA TO RUSSIA IN EUROPE ... 2015 HAS SEEN THE flourishing of conflicts that exist in a gray zone, one which is not quite open war but more than regular competition, which is attuned to globalization, which liberal democracies are illequipped to deal with, and which may well be the way power is exercised and conflict conducted in the foreseeable future.

Described by scholars as "hybrid," "full-spectrum," "nonlinear," "next-generation" or "ambiguous"—the variations in the description indicate the slipperiness of the subject—these conflicts mix psychological, media, economic, cyber, and military operations without requiring a declaration of war.

In the case of Russia's ongoing campaign in Ukraine, for example, hyperintense Russian propaganda has cultivated unrest inside the country by sowing enmity among segments of Ukrainian society and confusing the West with waves of disinformation, while Russian proxy forces and covert troops launch just enough military offensives to ensure that the Ukrainian government looks weak. The point is ... to destabilize Ukraine psychologically and advance a narrative of the country as a "failed state"

China's doctrine of the Three Warfares pushes these non-physical aspects even further, using "legal," "psychological" and "media" warfare to, in the words of the analyst Laura Jackson, who directed a Cambridge University and U.S. Defense Department research project on the subject, "undermine international institutions, change borders, and subvert global media, all without firing a shot." ...

An immediate aim of the Three Warfares is to spread China's dominion over the South China Sea, extending the country's maritime borders beyond boundaries recognized by the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea in order to control massive energy reserves and strategic sea-lanes worth \$5 trillion; ultimately, the hope is to supplant the United States as the security guarantor in the region. ...

The Chinese and Russian approaches both emphasize information war. ...

There is, of course, nothing new about using information as a

vital instrument of war. But in the past, information tended to be a handmaiden to action. Now the informational element appears to be as important as, if not more important than, the physical dimension. ... The Russian military might be small compared to America's, and the Russian economy may be a mess, but Vladimir Putin has cleverly undermined America's reputation as a "global policeman" and boosted his stature as the man who is restoring Russia as a Great Global Power. ...

... I asked senior officials how [NATO] dealt with new threats. The answer was essentially that ... [t]anks and nuclear missiles, and increasingly cyberattacks, they were on top of. Anything "gray" was only in development. ...

One of the great fears in all this is that a gray-zone conflict involving, say, U.S. and Chinese military vessels sparring in the South China Sea, or Russia threatening to deploy its nuclear arsenal—could tumble into an open one when some party miscalculates.

More likely, however, is that the patterns on display in 2015 will become more pronounced in the coming year. ...

It's a brave new war without beginning or end, where the borders of peace and war, serviceman and civilian have become utterly blurred—and where you and I are both a target and a weapon.

"In the new Russian doctrine, if complete peace is represented by the color white and all-out war by black, then between lies nearly an infinite number of shades of gray.... Of course, much of this 'new' kind of warfare is not really new—almost all the aspects it includes have long existed. Russia has used many of these tactics for years. Government Gives IRS Authority to Take Away Your Passport Robert Morley, December 28

U NITED STATES PRESIDENT BARACK OBAMA SIGNED THE FAST ACT highway transportation bill on December 4. And buried inside the bill was a little-mentioned provision vastly expanding the power of the government—and increasing potential abuses of power.

The provision was one that, as Politico wrote earlier this year, no one thought would even make it to the president's desk, let alone get signed.

Beginning in January, the Internal Revenue Service now has the *right to revoke your passport for unpaid taxes* if *it says* you owe \$50,000 or more (including penalties and interest). There are 12 million people in the U.S. the IRS says owe taxes.

The IRS does not have to prove you owe the money. It only has

to say that you do. The IRS does not have to ask a judge for permission to revoke your passport. An IRS official just sends an e-mail, and the State Department cancels it. And the law does not provide taxpayers an opportunity to challenge a finding that they owe back taxes in federal court before their passport is revoked.

No pay, no play. You stay. Because we say.

Konstitution, what Konstitution?

According to lawmakers, this is an effort to force more delinquents to pay their bills. It is shocking that lawmakers passed this bill. How could they give such vast power to an organization that is known to be used by politicians to target their enemies? This is a branch of government that needs less power, not more.

Americans should ask, why was this bill even needed? And what is the real motivation for this provision?

The IRS already has the power to file tax liens against all property you own, including property acquired after the lien is filed. The IRS also has the ability to empty your bank accounts without judicial review. It just has to send you a notice of payment saying how much you owe. If you don't challenge or pay within 10 days, it can empty your accounts. This is routine.

The Civil Asset Forfeiture Reform Act of 2000 also granted the IRS the power to seize the bank accounts of those suspected to be engaged in criminal activity—even when no charges have been filed and no convictions made. They can just take your money. And there is not much you can do. Unless the media picks up the story, the money is just gone. According to Forbes, in 2012 only 20 percent of the cases in which money was seized were criminal charges pursued! Eighty percent of victims were innocent in the eyes of the law—and they had their money stolen by the government anyway. Forbes calls it an "IRS horror story." Even the *New York Times* is reporting horror stories of abuse—by the government.

How has America gotten to the point that the government can take your money without even pressing charges against you and without even giving you a chance to defend yourself in court? And now, unelected, unaccountable bureaucrats can revoke your passport if you don't pay the taxes they say you owe—and you are not even entitled to a day in court!

Innocent until proven guilty, trial by jury, judicial review, separation of powers—are these not principles that America was supposedly founded upon?

How about freedom of movement? Is not the right to travel a fundamental freedom? Do you know that in many states, you soon won't be able to even board an airplane without a passport? So now the IRS can ban you from flying *within* America too. How is that constitutional?

The new law gets even worse. Politicians in their wisdom and desire to make the government more efficient let the IRS turn over debts they *say* you owe to *private debt collectors*. You know, those same violators of the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act that intimidate, harass, lie, threaten and break every rule Congress has passed to protect consumers. The very ones that Congress also says needs to be reined in.

Crime in Los Angeles Rose in All Categories in 2015 Los Angeles Times | December 30

COR THE FIRST TIME IN MORE THAN A DECADE, ALL CATEGORIES OF crime rose across Los Angeles in 2015 as police struggled to get control of the problem, according to LAPD data.

Violent crime in L.A. climbed 19.9 percent and property crime increased 10.3 percent through December 26 compared with the same period last year, according to the police data. It marked the second year in a row that violent crime rose, but the first time since 2003 that both violent and property crime rose.

The increases follow more than a decade of steep declines in crime, particularly in homicides. Police officials said the recent upswings should be viewed in that larger context. ...

Still, the increases have sparked concern in neighborhoods across the city, including Southside areas that have seen jumps in chair of Mermaids, a charity which provides support for families of children and teenagers with gender-identity issues.

Meanwhile some schools are seeing signs of a cluster effect, with a number of pupils coming forward to seek support towards a possible change after one takes the first step, she said. ...

A S OF LAST WEEK, 111 COMPANIES WORLDWIDE HAD DEFAULTED ON their obligations, the highest tally since 2009 when the figure hit 242 for the same period. About 60 percent of this year's global defaults have come from U.S. borrowers, Vazza wrote, up from 55 percent a year ago, when 33 of 60 defaulters were American.

This Day in History: 1999 Panama Canal Turned Over to Panama History.com | December 31

O N THIS DAY IN 1999, THE UNITED STATES, IN ACCORDANCE WITH the Torrijos-Carter Treaties, officially hands over control of the Panama Canal, putting the strategic waterway into Panamanian hands for the first time. ...

Interest in finding a shortcut from the Atlantic to the Pacific originated with explorers in Central America in the early 1500s. In 1523, Holy Roman Emperor Charles v commissioned a survey of the Isthmus of Panama and several plans for a canal were produced, but none ever implemented. U.S. interest in building a canal was sparked with the expansion of the American West and the California gold rush in 1848. (Today, a ship heading from New York to San Francisco can save about 7,800 miles by taking the Panama Canal rather than sailing around South America.)

In 1880, a French company run by the builder of the Suez Canal started digging a canal across the Isthmus of Panama (then a part of Colombia). More than 22,000 workers died from tropical diseases such as yellow fever during this early phase of construction and the company eventually went bankrupt, selling its project rights borrowing costs has made companies more vulnerable, Vazza wrote.

Database of 191 Million U.S. Voters Exposed on Internet Reuters | December 29

A N INDEPENDENT COMPUTER SECURITY RESEARCHER UNCOVered a database of information on 191 million voters that is exposed on the open Internet due to an incorrectly configured database, he said on Monday.

The database includes names, addresses, birth dates, party affiliations, phone numbers and e-mails of voters in all 50 U.S. states and Washington, researcher Chris Vickery said in a phone interview.

Vickery, a tech support specialist from Austin, Texas, said he

found the information while looking for information exposed on the Web in a bid to raise awareness of data leaks. ...

"The alarming part is that the information is so concentrated," Vickery said.

Vickery said he has not been able to identify who controls the database, but that he is working with U.S. federal authorities to find the owner so they can remove it from public view. He declined to identify the agencies. ...

Privacy advocates said Vickery's findings were troubling. ...

New Year's Surprise: Obama Regulation to Give Work Permits to Foreign College-Graduates Breitbart | December 30

Mohammed Rehman and his wife, Sana Khan, plotted to detonate a bomb that would have inflicted mass casualties in either the London Underground or the Westfield shopping center. Their online search history shows that the couple has a keen interest in the Islamic State. They had purchased 10 kilograms of urea nitrate to build the bomb. Rehman was arrested after he asked his Twitter followers which location he should target with his suicide bomb.
